Olivenhain Task Force News

A Committee of the Olivenhain Town Council

AN INTERESTING COMMENT HEARD AT THE WORKSHOP FOR THE COUNTY'S COMPREHENSIVE PLAN ... I attended the County Regional Comprehensive Plan (RCP) meeting held last month at the Encinitas Community and Senior Center. Aside from the usual propaganda, I came away hearing a very interesting comment.

Following a presentation by various county officials, the group of 50 plus attendees were divided into four topic groups one of which discussed transportation. Joe Kellejian, Solana Beach Deputy Mayor, was standing in front leading the discussion. Sitting at the back of the group was Marion Dodson, former Solana Beach Councilmember and outspoken proponent of adding a north-south highway immediately to the east of Olivenhain's backcountry. During the discussion, Joe explained that the County had commissioned a 2-year study into the possibility of adding another north-south highway east of I-15 "or west of I-15." The comment was made during an explanation of some other issue and no one present seemed to react (with the possible exception of Marion Dodson's smirky smile.)

Does this mean that "Son of 680" is coming back or imminent ... No. Does it mean we must remain vigilant ... Yes. Nothing in City or County politics is ever completely dead. Usually we are only a vote or two from swinging from "No" to "Yes."

I researched the topic on SANDAG's website. I found a link for the "North/South Transportation Facility Study Technical Working Group." on the SANDAG website at <http://www.sandag.org/index.asp?classid=13&fuseaction=home.classhome>. The committee's next meeting is October 16th at 1:30 pm. Meetings are open to the public and we should make sure someone from the eastern end of Olivenhain attend this meeting.

ORDINANCE FOR CCIP ... The Encinitas City Council took the first step towards passing the much debated Community Character Implementation Plan. New ordinances are read at two separate Council meetings and voted on before becoming law. The CCIP closes several loopholes and makes several ordinances less discretionary. Very few, if any changes, affect properties in Olivenhain. Most of the changes we focused on higher density zones than the Rural Residential (RR) 0.5 and 2 acre minimum found in Olivenhain. The ordinance must still go through another Council meeting and be approved by the Coastal Commission.

ENCINITAS TO INSTALL TRAIL ALONG LONE JACK ROAD ... From the Encinitas Trail Coalition's Newsletter I learned ... "Doug (Goad) reported last month the City" held citizen participation to discuss and understand issues related to installing a trail along the northwest side of Lone Jack north of Wildflower Estates. The trail number is trail #93.

Olivenhain trails are available for equestrian, pedestrian, bicyclists or non-motorized enjoyment. If you'd like to learn more about Trails in Olivenhain and Encinitas, the Encinitas Trails Coalition has a website at <http://www.encinitastrails.org/>. A NEWS ITEM FROM SUPERVISOR PAM SLATER'S EMAIL NEWSLETTER ... I get several newsletters via email. I thought this item from our County Supervisor's email newsletter was worthy of passing on ... County Supervisors took action and finalized the software filters for computers in county libraries that will block access to adult-themed and other inappropriate websites. The software will be installed starting Oct. 1. Adults can request that a filter be disabled for no more than 30 minutes.

The Meeting Hall Message Board

We love to see the welcomes and birthday celebrations posted on our Meeting Hall message board. Our new sign monitor, Patty Dutra would like to remind you about the guidelines for posting messages on the board.

- Messages may be posted for 72 hours. Residents are responsible for removing their messages after 72 hours.
- Messages must have a date showing when the message was posted. Dated messages may be removed after the 72-hour time period. Undated messages may be removed at any time.
- Place messages only in the area provided. Do not mount messages to the wooden frame or posts.
- Use only the push pins provided. Do not use hammers, nails, staples, glue, or tape as these will damage the message board.
- No "For Sale" or other solicitation signs are allowed.



Using the Meeting Hall

Thanks to all who are using the Meeting Hall. If you ever wondered about using the Meeting Hall for an event, the Meeting Hall is available for rent by individuals or organizations based on criteria designed to preserve the Meeting Hall and its surrounding grounds.

The renter must be an Olivenhain resident and a member of the Olivenhain Town Council or must be sponsored by a member. The renter must agree to abide by the Meeting Hall rules.

For our regular user's, it's is time to get all rental hall agreements and insurance riders updated for the new year. The Meeting Hall key box has been relocated to Russ Lanthorne's home. We believe this will make it more convenient to pick up and return the Meeting Hall key.

To rent the Meeting Hall, simply call or email Karen Mendez-Carter to schedule the date, get an insurance rider for the event naming OTC as an additional insured, sign the hall rental agreement, and submit a check for the rental fee with a second check for a \$100 refundable deposit. The fee for member use for social purposes ranges from \$20 to \$100 as follows:

- \$ 20 — Up to 20 people
- \$ 40 — 21-40 people
- \$ 60 — 41-60 people
- \$ 80 — 61-80 people
- \$100 — 91-100 people

Weddings and non-profit youth organizations have different fee structures. Please contact Karen for details.

Commissioner's Corner

We've received a number of emails asking about the increase in speed limit on Lone Jack Road and Encinitas Boulevard, so here's the scoop. Because of California's "Speed Trap" law, this was required for the speed limits on these streets to be enforced by radar.

The California Vehicle Code (Section 40802) stipulates that a speed limit established by local ordinance, not justified by an Engineering and Traffic Survey within seven years prior to the date of the alleged violation, and where enforcement involves the use of radar or other electronic devices is considered a "speed trap." Streets classified as "local" on the latest functional usage and federal aide system maps are automatically posted at 25 mph and do not require a speed survey to be radar enforceable in the City of Encinitas. Of the 54 street segments which are not classified as local, 6 are completely or partially within Olivenhain:

- El Camino del Norte from Rancho Santa Fe Road to the east city limits
- Encinitas Blvd. From Village Park Way to Rancho Santa Fe Road
- Lone Jack Road from Rancho Santa Fe Road to the North End
- Manchester Avenue from Encinitas Blvd. To El Camino Real
- Rancho Santa Fe Road from the North City Limits to Lone Jack Road
- Rancho Santa Fe Road from Lone Jack Road to Encinitas Blvd.

According to Vehicle Code Section 627, the Engineering and Traffic Survey must be completed in accordance with methods determined by CalTrans for use by state and local authorities. The CalTrans Traffic Manual states that the speed limit should normally be set at the first five mile per hour increment below the 85th percentile speed. (The 85th percentile speed is based on 85% of drivers traveling at that speed or slower — which means 15% of drivers travel faster!) It also states that in matching existing conditions with the traffic safety needs of the community, that engineering judgment may indicate the need for a further reduction of five miles per hour due to accident records, roadside conditions not readily apparent to the driver, and pedestrian and bicyclist safety.

So what about Lone Jack Road and Encinitas Boulevard? The 85th percentile speed was 51 mph on Encinitas Boulevard and 43 mph on Lone Jack Road. By the California Vehicle Code, unless the speed limit is posted at 50 mph on that segment of Encinitas Boulevard and 40 mph on Lone Jack Road, any speeding citations issued based on the original lower speed limit would be thrown out. The Traffic Commission approved the new speed limits, as did the Encinitas City Council, based on the assumption that it is better to be able to enforce the higher speed limit than to allow 10-15% of lawbreakers to get away with grossly exceeding the speed limit and having their citations thrown out.

While the original intent of this law — to protect unwary drivers from being trapped by sudden, unexpected reductions in speed limits — was probably warranted, I personally believe this section of the Vehicle Code is well overdue to be updated. The effect of this law is that 15% of our drivers, blatantly violating the posted speed limit, can create a new speed limit. But this can only be changed at the state level. Here in Encinitas, we can only take what steps we can to be able to enforce a speed limit. But none of us need to like it. What can you do? Drive the speed limit and be an Olivenhain pace car.

Trails Update - a local workshop was held for Trail 93 (North West side of Lone Jack Rd) to get local neighborhood inputs. The city has issued a request for proposal (RFP) to improve the trail. To see an example of the planned bridge check out the one off 13th street at the end of Via del Felecita. Also, a trails walk will be leaving from Little Oaks Park at 9:30 am Sunday, 28 September; all are welcome.

Hall property - it looks like the dog park might be the first facility to go on-line. An RFP has been issued for companies to bid on performing the 18 - 24 month environmental impact statement (study).

Beaches - the city has issued an RFP to build the new design for Beacons parking lot; contract to be awarded in October. An RFP is also out for playground equipment to be installed behind Moonlight Beach; award expected in November.

My special subcommittee meetings are being scheduled so let me know if you have any requests concerning: 4-H site location, Facility Use fee scheduling, or Encinitas Earth day April '04 event planning. As always you are welcome to bring issues to the Parks and Redecoration Commission during Oral Communications every 3rd Tuesday in Council Chambers, 5pm; don't be shy.

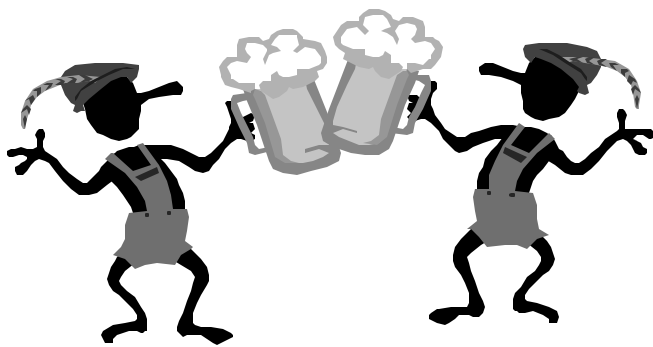
