8 LOT SUBDIVISION GOING IN NEXT TO THE 7-11 ... The 8 units are proposed on the vacant lot and another adjacent property on the WEST side of RSF Rd. According to the plans distributed at the April 19th neighborhood meeting, a total of eight houses will be built. This initial request is to subdivide the land and grade for house pads. According to the handout, access to the subdivision will be gained via McCain Lane, an existing private street connecting to Encinitas Blvd. None of the homes will access RSF Road. As currently proposed, the project would be responsible for widening RSF Rd along it's frontage. We will certainly ask for a trail along this side (the western side) of RSF Rd and try to maintain some of the existing rolling-hill character.

Where is the project in the City's approval process? They held their neighborhood notification meeting back in April. It is currently in the "environmental review and comment period." This is the public's opportunity to comment on any and all environmental impacts the project will cause. Any comments must be submitted to the City Planning Department by 6 pm on November 10th. Given that this is only a 8 unit subdivision, the project will most likely be categorized as a no impact project (called "Mitigated Negative Declaration" in California Government speak.) On many projects, especially larger projects, the environmental review comments can include projected impacts to traffic, aesthetics, noises, public services, utilities/sewers, cultural resources, hydrology/water quality, population/housing, agricultural resources and biological resources. COMMUNITY CHARACTER IMPLEMENTATION PROGRAM ... The City Council has completed their work on the ordinance updates. Ironically, after all the comments, innuendo and rancor; the final ordinance was considered without much in the way of a public showing at the Council's September 17th Meeting. The ordinance was introduced at this meeting and was scheduled for its final reading on October 22nd. I believe it passed and becomes effective December 31, 2004. So after all this, what ordinances were changed? Mostly building height and lot coverage. Buildings in Olivenhain and RR-2/RR zones can go 4 feet taller without the previously-required administrative approval. Houses another zones are now limited to an absolute maximum of 26 feet. The loop hole that allowed houses on stilts to be considered as having zero lot coverage (so-called mushroom houses) has been closed. Many other minor changes have been incorporated make the ordinances more consistent. 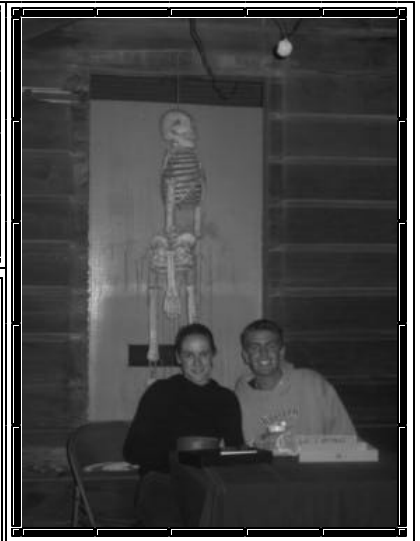

We discussed how to repair the back door and we also looked around and saw that nothing had been taken and there was no other damage inside the Hall. Upon further inspection we discovered that the door leading under the Hall had also incurred minor damaged, nothing broken - we took the lock off and did some re-bending, all is well. The police department was called and at 4PM they came by and he gave me the report number that is now on file. Wood molding was purchased, the panel was re-glued and everything is in working order. We will need to find the correct molding that is in place on the entire door and then we will have the door back to its beautiful self.

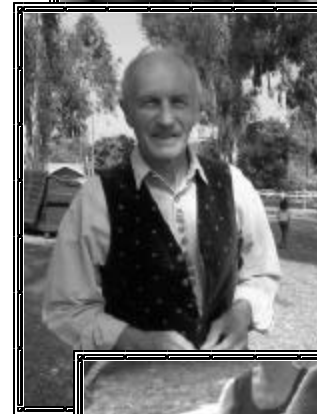

We reviewed a very successful season of Recreation activities from Junior Lifeguards (on line registration - yeah) to Open Mike teen sessions at the Community Center.
